Jonathan Luke Austin is a political sociologist exploring the global ontologies of political violence. Austin's expertise focuses on social theory and philosophy, the possibility and prevention of political violence, Middle Eastern politics, and related topics, as well as art, literature, and world politics. Presently, Austin leads the Violence Prevention (VIPRE) Initiative. The Initiative is a multi-year and multi-researcher project designed by Austin and funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation investigating novel (pragmatist) sociological approaches for the prevention of war crimes and human rights violations by translating cutting-edge social theory into empirical and practical purchase. Austin's work has been published or is forthcoming in European Journal of International Relations, International Political Sociology, Review of International Studies, European Journal of International Security, Security Dialogue, & beyond.
